The Rev. Dr. James C. Goodloe IV is the Executive Director of the Foundation for Reformed Theology. The Foundation was begun by the late Dr. and Mrs. John H. Leith, Professor of Theology, Union

Theological Seminary in Virginia, to renew the theology, vision, and hope of Reformed and Presbyterian congregations. The Foundation continues to promote the Reformation and the building up of the local congregation by equipping pastors to be ever faithful preachers, teachers, and counselors.

A native of Tennessee, Jim holds degrees from Davidson College (A.B., 1975), Union Theological Seminary in Virginia (D.Min., 1979), and The University of Chicago (Ph.D., 1987). Ordained to the ministry of Word and Sacrament by the Presbyterian Church in the United States, 1979, he has served with congregations in Georgia, North Carolina, and Virginia, most recently Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church, Richmond.

Dr. Goodloe has been active in the life of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) at all levels, including 10 years on the denomination's committee for ordination examinations, chairing it for the last four of those years.

Dr. Goodloe is married to Deborah, a graduate of Longwood College and the former P.S.C.E., and serves as a Christian Educator. Their daughter, Campbell Goodloe Hackett, Ph.D. (Princeton Theological Seminary), is a pastor in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

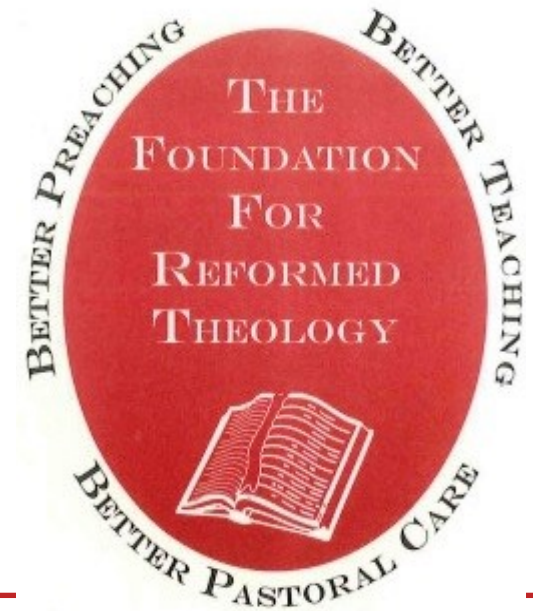

Affirming Reformed Theology

Quail Hollow Presbyterian Church is pleased to host The Foundation for Reformed Theology's weekend seminar, **Affirming Reformed Theology**, October 20 – 22, 2017, led by the Rev. Dr. James C. Goodloe IV, Executive Director. The seminar is the first of The Foundation's seminars in the Charlotte area. In 2016, The Foundation held 19 seminars across the United States involving a total of 111 participants.

The Foundation's mission is to be "committed to studying, learning, receiving, and appropriating the faith and teachings of those who have gone before us in order to apply that theology to the faith and life of the church. The Foundation affirms that a lifetime of diligent study and understanding of Reformed theology builds up the Reformed and Presbyterian congregations of the church, in particular, and the entire church of Jesus Christ, in general.

The seminar, **Affirming Reformed Theology**, will include 3 sessions:

- I: "Faith, Repentance, and the Christian Life"
II: "Being Reformed and Presbyterian Today"
III: "Christian Hope in History & for Eternal Life"
Each session will include lecture and discussion.

What is Reformed Theology?

The leaders of the first generation of the Protestant Reformation, including Martin Luther (1483-1546), were committed to the authority of the Scriptures as the word of God. Through the scriptures, they rediscovered the gospel of Jesus Christ as salvation by grace through faith.

The leaders of the second generation of the Protestant Reformation, including John Calvin (1509-1564), sought to be even more thoroughly Reformed according to the word of God. They were led to an additional emphasis on the sovereignty of God and on the Christian life of worship and obedience.

The Foundation for Reformed Theology affirms the faithfulness, wisdom, depth, and vigor of these Reformers and of those theologians of later generations who built upon their articulation of the Christian faith. Their theology has had a profound impact upon the church and human history, for they described with authenticity both the human condition and the reality of God as revealed in Jesus Christ.

The Vision of the Foundation

The Foundation understands that the faith and life of the church today can be best upheld, sustained, and respected through the church's own historic faith and practices, particularly preaching, teaching, and pastoral care, which have a proven record of building up the church. Thus, the Foundation works to strengthen pastors in their ministry of the gospel of Jesus Christ as attested to in the Scriptures, as summarized in the creeds and confessions of the church, and as articulated in the classic texts of Reformed theology, all to the glory of God.
